WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL

History

Wheelchair Basketball (WCB) first emerged around 1946 in the USA, developed by injured servicemen from World War II. Most were former able-bodied players who wanted to continue playing the game. The simple adaptations and slight rule variations for people in wheelchairs allowed the sport to spread across the US, and eventually worldwide.



USSOCOM in WCB

Wheelchair Basketball is one of the three recognized "Team Sports", alongside Wheelchair Rugby and Sitting Volleyball, in the *DoD Warrior Games* and *International Invictus Games* slate of adaptive Sports. Each year, recovering service members and veterans from all branches of service including SOCOM represent their respective teams and compete in these highly competitive events. Rules of WCB (DoD Warrior Games/ Invictus Games)

The primary rules of a Wheelchair Basketball game are quite similar to that of a regular basketball game. The rules include minor modifications that meet the needs of the players in the wheelchair, during a game. Today, the Wheelchair basketball players compete in tournaments and other minor activities based on the rules given by the governing body, the International Wheelchair Basketball Federation (IWBF). Here are the three primary rules of the game discussed extensively:

FOULS

- In the game, <u>your wheelchair is part of your body</u>—which is in connection with establishing a sense of
 responsibility for all contact in the court, i.e., in the case of blocking, going out of bounds, charging, and
 many other violations.
- The regulations of the game don't allow you to stay put in a key area for more than three seconds as an offensive player.
- Lifting your legs or body to gain an advantage to take a shot is a technical foul. Thus, you must remain seated in your chair while you pass, shoot, or dribble the ball. And you're not allowed to use your limbs to wheel your chair—as it's an unfair advantage.
- In a scenario where you fall off your chair, the referee is likely to stop the game, if he believes you're at risk of getting injured. Otherwise, the game will continue.

DRIBBLING

- You can bounce the ball and drive your chair simultaneously in wheelchair basketball. But, you're not allowed to push your wheelchair more than twice, holding the ball or having it on your lap, before passing, dribbling or shooting.
- In wheelchair basketball, there's no double-dribble rule. Hence, if you take more than two pushes while you have the ball, without dribbling, it will be counted as a traveling violation.
- You're not allowed to have any contact with your feet on the playing surface, while you have the ball.

SCORING

Scoring remains constant with the standard National Basketball Association scoring system. A team on offense with the basketball may score a basket when the following occurs:

- A free throw to the basketball counts 1 point
- A throw from a two-point field goal zone counts 2 points
- A throw from a three-point field zone counts 3 points

Classification

The classification in wheelchair basketball involves measuring and categorizing a player's functional ability to handle all the skills necessary to play the game—which are pivoting, shooting, dribbling, pushing, catching, and rebounding. It's crucial to note that it has nothing to do with the assessment of a player's skill level. Particularly, the stability and trunk movement of a player observed during the pivoting, shooting, dribbling, pushing, catching, and rebounding, forms the allocation of a player to a specific class. Before a major tournament begins, all participating athletes will be classified by an independent third-party qualified medical professional.

Equipment


The wheelchair, which is the primary piece of equipment for the game, has evolved with the sport over the last 50 years. In the past, players had to use typical stainless-steel wheelchairs, which came with arm and footrests—weighing about 30 lbs. As the game evolved, the wheelchairs produced for the game became lightweight and streamlined. The features give players the room for agility and speed with a cutting-edge design as well as a sport-enhancing functionality. These days, sports wheelchair manufacturers construct the wheelchairs with aircraft aluminum or titanium to get the ideal weight and form required for optimal performance. They also include an extra fifth and sixth wheel for improved mobility and stability. The new wheelchairs also come with a well-designed front bumper that can't be hooked or held by an opponent. The angle of the wheelbase is suitable for quick turns and stability. The wheels on the chair now come with cables, rather than the conventional steel spokes. The new ones are usually 50 percent lighter and three times stronger than the steel spokes.



BASKETBALL COURT

WCB can be played on any basketball court in gymnasiums, arenas, outdoor recreational complex, etc. Playing the game outdoors or indoors is up to the preference of the participants and resources of the governing body. As long as it's on a flat surface and a standard size court with suitable hoop & nets are available, WCB may be played.





BASKETBALL

The standard size of the ball mirrors that of the National Basketball Association and all other adjacent professional entities (29.5" / Size 7). Size 7 basketballs measure 29.5" in circumference and have a standard weight of 22 oz.

WCB Myths

There most common Wheelchair Basketball adaptive sport myth is that you must be daily wheelchair user or suffer from a severe mobility impairment to participate in the sport. This is **FALSE!** In fact, most athletes that compete on a WCB team in the DoD Warrior Games or Invictus Games are actually fully able-bodied. For military events, WCB is a recognized team sport in order to level the playing field and remain inclusive to all our recovering service members and veterans.

Similarities to Basketball

One could make the case that WCB is very similar to able-bodied basketball, and that most of the differences lie within the use of a WCB wheelchair. Besides the mode of travel on the court, the same basketball court, team size, balls, and scoring system are all similarly used to that of the National Basketball Association and other adjacent professional organizations.

Differences to Basketball

There are a few notable rule modifications that coincide with the use of wheelchairs in this adaptive sport. Most notable are that your wheelchair is an extension of the athlete's body—which is in connection with establishing a sense of responsibility for all contact in the court, i.e., in the case of blocking, going out of bounds, charging, and many other violations. The regulations of the game also don't allow you to stay put in a key area for more than three seconds as an offensive player.

Aside from the rules, the execution of the sport biomechanics is actually much more difficult when compared to able-bodied basketball. To see for yourself, try shooting a basketball from the 3-point line in a seated position. The focus of athletic movement is placed on the athlete's upper body when pushing the wheelchair and conducting all individual sport immediate actions – shooting, blocking, passing, etc.

History

Wheelchair Rugby (WCR) was invented in 1977 in Winnipeg, Canada, by a group of tetraplegic athletes – athletes with paralysis of both the arms and legs – looking for an alternative to Wheelchair Basketball. The creators wanted a sport that would allow players with reduced arm and hand function to participate equally.

Rules of WCR (DoD Warrior Games/ Invictus Games)

The object of the game is to carry the ball across the opposing team's goal line and stop them from doing the same at the other end. Two wheels must cross the line for the goal to count, and the player must have firm control of the ball when he or she crosses the line. Matches are split into four eight-minute quarters. There is a two-minute break between quarters and a five-minute break at halftime. Wheelchair Rugby is played using a standard volleyball on a 28m x 15m hardwood basketball court divided into two halves with a center circle and a try line at each end.

It's a high-impact sport, which is why the wheelchairs have a solid frame, an anti-tip device at the rear and a double bumper. Players aren't allowed to grab an opponent with their hands, and excessive contact could cause injury, which leads to sanctions. Wheelchair rugby is a full-contact game and chair contact is encouraged. To ensure player safety, however, players cannot strike another player's wheelchair anywhere behind the axle of the rear wheel if it causes the chair to rotate horizontally or vertically. Physical body contact is also not permitted.

The rules of Wheelchair Rugby were inspired by rugby, basketball and hockey. The player in possession must dribble at least once or the ball must be passed at least every 10 seconds. Unlike in the able-bodied game, forward passes are allowed. Players can progress towards to opponent's goal by throwing, rolling, dribbling or carrying the ball on their knees. The defending team must have no more than three players in the key. From when they gain possession, a team has just 40 seconds to score a try.

After inbounding the ball, a team has 12 seconds to bring the ball over the half-court line. Each team has four timeouts of 30 seconds each, which may be used during regulation play and may be called by players on the floor, and two one-minute bench timeouts. If the score is tied, an overtime period of three minutes will be played. Additional overtime periods will be played until one team wins.

Like in wheelchair basketball, every player is assigned a point value based on their functional ability, from 0.5 for a player with the least physical function through to 3.5 for the most physical function. The total on-court value for each team of 4 four cannot exceed 8 eight points.

Classification

The classification in wheelchair rugby involves measuring and categorizing a player's functional ability to handle all the skills necessary to play the game—which are pivoting, dribbling, pushing, catching, and rebounding. It's crucial to note that it has nothing to do with the assessment of a player's skill level. Particularly, the stability and trunk movement of a player observed during the pivoting, dribbling, pushing, catching, and rebounding, forms the allocation of a player to a specific class. Before a major tournament begins, all participating athletes will be classified by an independent third-party qualified medical professional.

Wheelchair Rugby players are given points based upon their amount of available movement. Players with the least movement score lower than those with more. A team is made up of four players that can be in any combination as long as their points total does not exceed a total of 8. Teams are allowed half a point extra for each female player on court.

To be eligible, athletes with spinal cord injuries must have impairment in at least three limbs. Athletes without spinal cord injuries (such as cerebral palsy or amputation) must have impairment in all four limbs.

Typically, an athlete is assigned a class following the completion of the bench test and the functional skills test prior to game play (observation of ball handling and wheelchair skills). The athlete's execution of ball and wheelchair handling skills are observed on court during actual play to make a final determination of the athlete's class.

Players are classed into one of seven classes (0.5, 1.0, 1.5, 2.0, 2.5, 3.0, or 3.5) depending on their functional ability. The higher classes are assigned to players with higher functional levels, while lower classifications are assigned to players with less functional ability.

Equipment



Wheelchair Rugby requires specialized types of wheelchair that fits into two main categories - Offensive/High-Point Chairs and Defensive/Low-Point Chairs. Athletes with more function (Higher Sport Class - 2.0-3.5, typically) tend to use wheelchairs with metal wings in the front of the chair, which reduce opposing athletes' ability to stop their chair as they attempt to move up court and score. Athletes with less function (Lower Sport Class - 0.0-1.5, typically) tend to use wheelchairs that have a metal extension, called a picker, which can be used to slow or stop opposing athletes' wheelchair from moving. Both types of chairs have similar attributes of hard plastic or metal spoke guards.

RUGBY/BASKETBALL COURT

VOLLEYBALL

Wheelchair Rugby uses a regulation volleyball typically of a 'soft-touch' design, with a slightly textured surface to provide a better grip. The balls are normally over-inflated compared to volleyball, to provide a better bounce.

Similarities to Rugby

Much like able-bodied rugby matches, highly competitive wheelchair rugby games are fluid and fast-moving, with possession switching back and forth between the teams while play continues. The game clock is stopped when a goal is scored or in the event of a violation—such as the ball being played out of bounds—or a foul. Players may only be substituted during a stoppage in play. The games' ultimate objective is the same, to move the ball past your opponents goal line.

Differences to Rugby

There are a few notable rule modifications that coincide with the use of wheelchairs in this adaptive sport. Most notable are that your wheelchair is an extension of the athlete's body—which is in connection with establishing a sense of responsibility for all contact in the court, i.e., in the case of blocking, going out of bounds, charging, and many other violations.

Aside from the rules, Wheelchair Rugby is also typically a mixed-gender sport that allows forward passes. The ball utilized is also a standard volleyball instead of a Rugby Football.

History

Sitting Volleyball was invented in the Netherlands by the Dutch Sport Committee in 1956 as a rehabilitation sport for injured soldiers. The sport originated as a combination of volleyball and sitzball, a German sport with no net but seated players. Since then, it has become one of the most popular Para sports in the world. Men's Sitting Volleyball was first included in the Arnhem 1980 Paralympic Games with the women's version following in Athens 2004. It has always been a clear staple for team sports in United States Armed Forces and USSOCOM adaptive sport programs.

Rules of SVB (DoD Warrior Games/Invictus Games) Page 11 of 54

SVB is a discipline of the sport in which athletes play in a seated position. This sitting game utilizes the same volleyball skills and techniques as the standing game with a few key rule differences. Players use both their arms and legs to move across the court, and it's a physical, fast-paced game. USA Volleyball is the official National Governing Body for sitting volleyball, for which the DoD Warrior Games and Invictus Games has adapted the rules set from.

SVB is a sport played by two teams on a playing court divided by a net. There are different versions available for specific circumstances in order to offer the versatility of the game to everyone. The object of the game is to send the ball over the net in order to ground it on the opponent's court, and to prevent the same effort by the opponent. The team has three hits for returning the ball (in addition to the block contact). The ball is put in play with a service: hit by the server over the net to the opponents. The rally continues until the ball is grounded on the playing court, goes "out" or a team fails to return it properly. In SVB, the team winning a rally scores a point (Rally Point System). When the receiving team wins a rally, it gains a point and the right to serve, and its players rotate one position clockwise.

Within the DoD Warrior Games and Invictus Games competitions, teams consist of 12 players and may be same gender or mixed gender. The tournament within these competitions consists of pool and bracket play. Pool winners advance to bracket play, which determines medal contention. Athletes are classified based on functional limitation (minimum, moderate and maximum). Of the six players on the court per team, no more than five players can be of the same classification. Players must have some part of the upper body (bottom to shoulders) in contact with the floor at the moment of ball contact, during all contact points of the game.

The introduction of a specialist defensive player(s) – the Libero(s) – has moved the game forward in terms of rally length and multi-phase play. Modifications to the service rule have changed the act of service from simply a means of putting the ball in play to an offensive weapon. The concept of rotation is entrenched to allow for all-round athletes. The rules on player positions permit teams to have flexibility and to create interesting developments in tactics. Competitors use this framework to contest techniques, tactics and power. The framework allows players a freedom of expression to enthuse spectators and viewers.

Classification

The Warrior Games and Invictus Games Classification System is sport-specific in which classification protocols such as testing impairments for flexibility, range of motion and/or strength, and functional observation are considered to ensure correct athlete classification specific to each sport. Athlete classifications will be determined prior to athlete registration and arrival at the Warrior Games/Invictus Games and IAW established Warrior Games/Invictus Games classification criteria. Athletes with a serious visual impairments are not permitted to compete in Sitting Volleyball. There are <u>3 Classifications</u> for the SVB Competition at the DoD Warrior Games and Invictus Games, and a mix must be present at all times on the court:




SITTING VOLLEYBALL COURT

SVB can be played on any basketball court in gymnasiums, arenas, outdoor recreational complex, etc. Playing the game outdoors or indoors is up to the preference of the participants and resources of the governing body. As long as it's on a flat surface and a standard size court. The playing area includes the playing court and the free zone. It shall be rectangular and symmetrical. The playing court is a rectangle measuring 10 x 6 m, surrounded by a free zone which is a minimum of 3 m wide on all sides. The free playing space is the space above the playing area which is free from any obstructions. The free playing space shall measure a minimum of 7 m in height from the playing surface. The surface must be flat, horizontal and uniform. It must not present any danger of injury to the players. It is forbidden to play on rough or slippery surfaces. All lines are 5 cm wide and they must be of a light color which is different from the color of the floor and from any other lines.



SITTING VOLLEYBALL NET

Placed vertically over the center line there is a net whose top is set at the height of 1.15 m for men. Its height is measured from the center of the playing court. The net height over the two side lines must be exactly the same and must not exceed the official height by more than 2 cm.





VOLLEYBALLS

SVB uses a regulation volleyball typically of a 'soft-touch' design, with a slightly textured surface to provide a better grip. The balls are normally inflated to regulation PSI to provide a better volley.



Sitting Volleyball Myths

There most common SVB adaptive sport myth is that you must be daily wheelchair user, be a lower body amputee, or suffer from a severe mobility impairment to participate in the sport. This is **FALSE!** In fact, most athletes that compete on a SVB team in the DoD Warrior Games or Invictus Games are actually fully able-bodied. For military events, SVB is a recognized team sport in order to level the playing field and remain inclusive to all our recovering service members and veterans.

Similarities to Volleyball

Much like able-bodied volleyball games, highly competitive SVB games are fluid and fast-moving, with volleys bouncing back and forth between the teams while play continues. The game clock is stopped when a volley is scored or in the event of a violation—such as the ball being played out of bounds—or a foul. Players may only be substituted during a stoppage in play. The games' ultimate objective is the same, the first team to score the first to 25 points wins that set. Each team is allowed to have up to three contacts with the ball before returning it to the opposing team's side of the court.

Differences to Volleyball

In SVB, the net is about 3 feet high, and the court is 10 x 6 meters with a 2-meter attack line. The court is divided into two sides of 5m deep by 6m wide. The net height is set at a height of 1.15m for men, and 1.05m for women. Players are allowed to block serves, but one "cheek" must be in contact with the floor whenever they make contact with the ball. Players must remain in contact with the court at all times when handling the ball. Standing, rising, or taking steps is not permitted. A short loss of contact with the court is permitted in two scenarios: when making a defensive play in the back zone to save a ball and when making a defensive play in the front zone. Rather than a best of 5 sets, sitting volleyball is a best of three sets, played to 25 points, but you have to win by two. If a third set is necessary, that set is played to 15 points, also having to win by two.
