What is the U.S. Special Operations Command Care Coalition?

The U.S. Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) Warrior Care Program (Care Coalition) aims to provide Special Operations warriors and their families a model advocacy program in order to enhance their quality of life and strengthen Special Operations readiness. The model includes the following: a focus on the special operation at hand with an emphasis on returning as many wounded, ill or injured Service members to duty as quickly as possible, operationally fit and mentally prepared; recognition of family security, safety and well-being as critical to mission success; accomplishment of the special operation by, through and/or with other government and non-government organizations, ensuring the forces are provided with the best possible service.

Which population does this program serve?

This program is available to Special Operations warriors and their families.

How can this program help wounded warriors and their families?

The USSOCOM Warrior Care Program (Care Coalition) provides a variety of non-medical case management services to Special Operations warriors and their families through their recovery, rehabilitation, reintegration and transition. In addition, Liaisons facilitate inpatient and outpatient medical treatment; and Advocates provide support for return-to-duty, retired and separated Service members.

How can this program help Recovery Care Coordinators?

The services provided by the USSOCOM Warrior Care Program (Care Coalition) can also be accessed by Recovery Care Coordinators (RCCs) on behalf of recovering Service members and their families. These services will help RCCs ensure that recovering Service members and families move quickly through the healthcare system, receive the guidance and support they need through the reintegration process, and are otherwise well-equipped to meet their goals.
