- Commander's priorities: People, Win, Transform

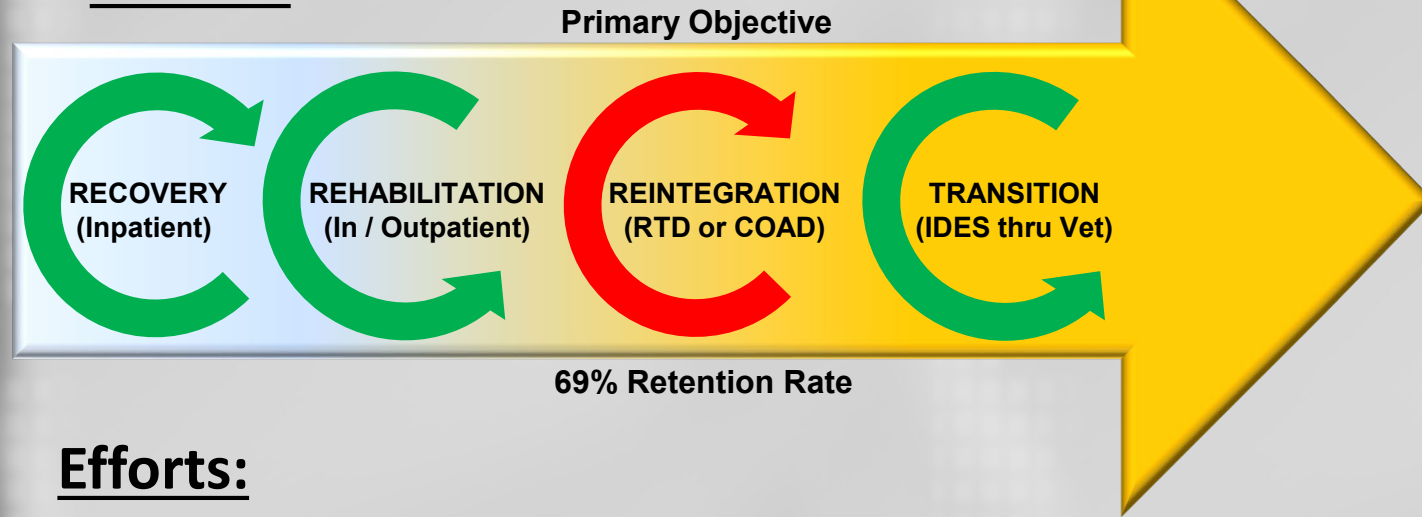

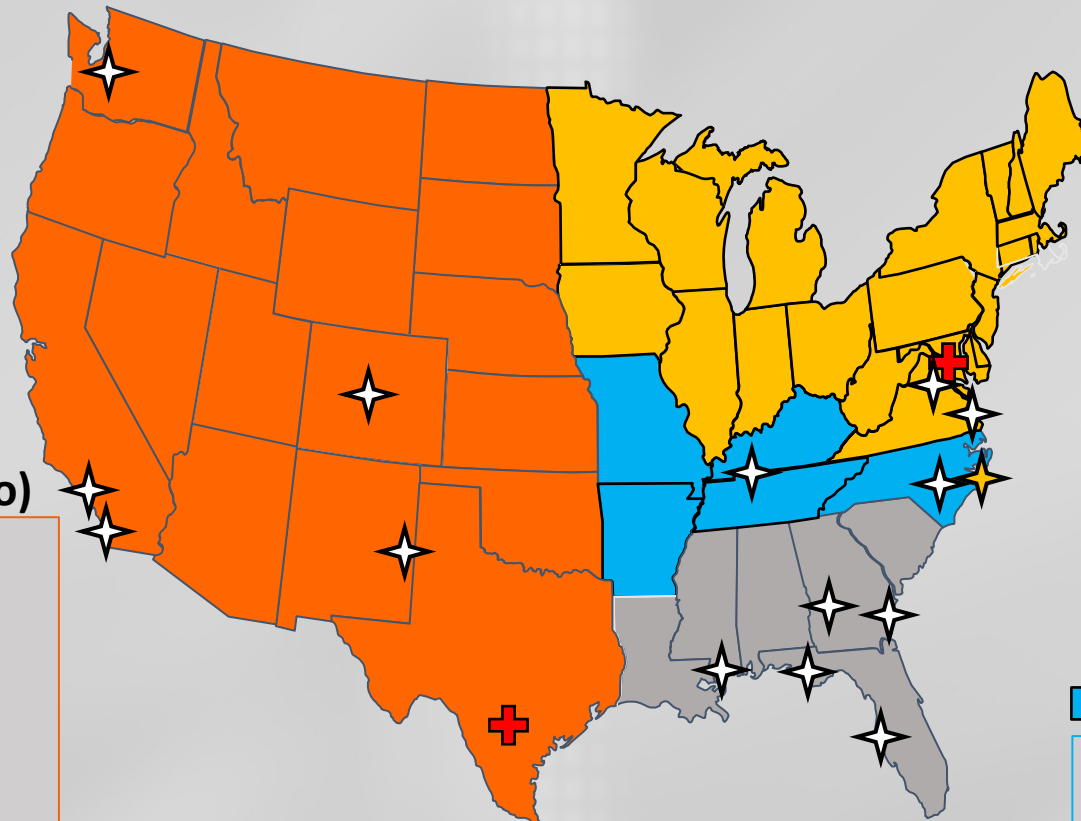
